

FACTS ABOUT ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES IN THE WORKPLACE

- In 2020, 17.9 percent of persons with a disability were employed.
- In 2023, 22.5% of people with a disability were employed.

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FACTS ON PEOPLE WITH AUTISM

- Nearly half of 25-year-olds with autism have never held a paying job.
- Only 55.1 percent of young adults with autism held paying job during their first six years out of high school, the lowest percentage among the disability categories.
- 9 out of 10 are either unemployed or underemployed, regardless of their IQ or education level.

- * More than 6.1 million job listings on ZipRecruiter's website alone list communication as a requirement.

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Problem-solving involves the ability to identify alternative solutions. Examples of problem-solving skills: Critical thinking Analysis Strategic thinking Initiative




Work Ethic is vital to getting the job and keeping the job.

* BY SUPPORTING THE INDIVIDUAL!


Once employed, be a voice of support for the person with their employer when needed.

*Mow lawn







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
- It's natural to work (most people do)
